At the end of Form 3, I was nominated to join the English debate team. At first, I questioned why my English teacher made that choice. How could I even succeed in debates if I could not even talk to people properly? Luckily, the people in my debate team were very eager to help me learn, slowly guiding me through the tedious learning process. After a while, I became better at forming sentence structures by having practice debates, and sooner or later my first milestone approached.

After all the practice debates I had in school, it finally came to the moment I was chosen to participate in the HKPTU Debating Competition against Rui Ching Secondary School. There was some burden placed on me because it was the first time I participated in an official debate. However, I didn't let that get to me. It was the first time I tried it, and it was different from what I had experienced in school. The saying that 'You don't really experience something until you see it for your own eyes' was on point. I felt edgy, but that also sparked my interest in debates.
