Only certain areas in the world have the ideal temperature, sunlight and rainfall needed for a tropical rain forest. Many of the plants and animals in tropical rain forests cannot be found elsewhere in the world.

Over half of the wildlife in the world is living in the tropical rain forests. Spider monkeys swing among the lianas.

The tropical rain forest is the home of many plants and animals. When parts of the rain forest are destroyed, the natural habitats disappear. This causes the loss of many rain forest creatures. Some large animals, such as leopards, live in the rain forest. They cannot exist in small forests. Insects that rely on food from the leaves or bark of the trees disappear when the trees are cut down. Hummingbirds and songbirds from colder lands migrate to the warm rain forests in winter. As the tropical rain forests are cleared, these huge flocks of birds cannot find their habitats in winter. Without shelter and food, the bird population decreases.
